

International Law LL.M.: International Cultural Heritage Law Concentration

To earn an LL.M. in International Law, a student must complete 24 semester hours of credit with a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.50. A summer term is counted as a semester for this purpose. The LL.M. program may be completed on either a full-or part-time basis but must be completed within four years.

Core Courses (9 credit hours):

- Law 448: International Business Transactions
- Law 349: International Trade Law
- Law 422: Public International Law

Students must successfully complete the nine credit hours of required coursework and an additional fifteen credit hours in one of the international law areas of specialization. For the International Cultural Heritage Law area of specialization, students must complete the additional fifteen credit hours as follows:
