

DMC Co-Director Dr. Shailja Sharma Gives Keynote at **Grace School of Diplomacy** Conference to Attendees From Around the World Professor Sharma addressed and highlighted the complex realities of forced migration in her keynote on October 3, 2024 at the Diplomacy and Forced Migration: Transnational Realities + Trans-professional Responses conference. Country Round Tables included speakers from around the world such as Bangladesh, Sudan, the U.S, Germany, and Mexico. Dr. Sharma emphasized how the global North often frames migrants as problems rather than recognizing their

humanity and contributions. Sharma acknowledged that the nation-state's

overlooks systemic issues and historical

contexts. Her keynote focused on topics
